Mission Statement: The Utah Storm Water Advisory Committee will coordinate efforts to reduce storm water pollution and provide adequate flood control. The committee will jointly review governing regulations, disseminate information to enhance compliance with those regulated, promote effective storm water management training, and assist local municipalities and other interested parties to implement best management practices, consistent with their individual needs and resources. The committee will also review any proposed storm water regulations to assess potential impacts on the regulated community.

5. State of Utah Updates:
  - a. DWQ Programs and EPA by Jeff Studenka: *Jeff is moving the Surface Waters division. Assistant Director Kim Shelley will hopefully attend next month and introduce Jeff’s replacement. EPA phone call today to discuss permitting, but not likely to be much related to storm water.*
  - b. Municipal Program by Rhonda Thiele: *Clarification regarding dry weather screening versus priority area inspections. Dry weather screening is to check for flows during dry weather and then use your SOPs to trace, cease and enforce as necessary. Priority area inspections are not just at outfalls. These could be areas of old infrastructure, past illicit discharges, etc. This is part of*

*section 4.2.3.3.1., the list can be added to and changed based on your documented rationale. The county health department may be able to tell you the past issues and recommend priority areas.*

  - d. Construction Program by Harry Campbell: *Need to go thru rule making with Expedited Settlement Offering. ITRC, look at government problems. Utah is behind the national curve. Looking at the resources available through this group. Share information and ideas. EPA was here for a week in March. They want the State to do 10% of the inspections. State does approximately 5-7%, the requirement changed a couple years ago, and the State is working towards the funding to hire the staff to reach 10%. The EPA comes in to help fill the difference. EPA not filling in positions, and there is a proposed budget cut to the EPA. Keeping an eye on it, just like everyone. DWQ is 1/3 funded by Federal money.*

6. USWAC Subcommittees Updates:
- a. Industrial: *Greg Baptist: Met on Monday to work on program, presentation to be rolled out next month to provide to Coalitions. Subcommittee meets at Salt Lake County North Building room 3500, 10:30 to noon Monday before USWAC. Paul Taylor: I was oblivious to the requirements for MS4s, strongly encourage you to have the presentation at your Coalition meetings. Many requirements are being missed because of the lack of understanding. These guys are from Phase 1 communities and have years of experience dealing with industrial requirements.*
  - b. Long Term Storm Water Management: *Tom Beesley This subcommittee is not the same as the LID review group. Template changes have been suggested. Two sections were eliminated. MS4s can tailor the standard template text to reflect local conditions and needs. Section: 1 summarize the infrastructure for that site, to explain the system, environment and conditions that can contribute to pollution, this page generally becomes one to two pages long. SOPs are an industry standard now and minor template adjustments were included to increase understanding. Encourage existing entities to use their own SOPs rather than creating new SOPs from scratch, review the existing SOPs for content to cover the unique site exposures and operations. Then add new SOPs for exposures and operations not already covered. Documentation sheets have changed to reflect a year of feedback from Operators and recent direction from the DWQ MS4 Program Managers. The maintenance schedule was modified to answer Operator feedback. A maintenance log was added to reflect the recent direction from DWQ MS4 Program Managers. The updated template is posted on the USWAC Page at <https://uswac.org/forms> See Long Term Stormwater Management Plan and Agreement item.*

- c. R.S.I. Program: *Last week, Trace, Dan and Paul reviewed the management scope with LTAP. They had good ideas to help both programs. They are putting together a scope, and we'll be moving down that road. It will be better to centralize the operations. LTAP will not provide the trainers. Discussion about instructor pay. Last class was in Riverton, the schedule is not up to date. May<sup>16th</sup> next class. Recertification in June. CEUs are available through free options. Retaking RSI cost, same as taking it. There is information in the recertification correspondence.*
  - d. R.S.W. Program: *Class in June/July. Volunteers to take the course to try it out. Requirements to be instructor will be a little more stringent, i.e. registered engineers. In process of writing the exam.*
