*Steve Switzer, of Michael Baker Associates, introduced the speaker for today's presentation.*
  - *The speaker was Scott Taylor. He gave a presentation on the recently formed National Municipal Stormwater Alliance (NMSA). This is a new 501(c)(3) corporation formed specifically for MS4 issues. Their goal, and agenda, is to connect and unite MS4 programs nationwide in an effort to coordinate efforts of all of the MS4s, promote messaging and communications, provide education, and be and advocate of policy. They have organized themselves currently with an executive committee and a membership that currently consists of 12 members. They are recruiting and looking for more memberships (similar to our USWAC committee). There are also "affiliate" members consisting of consultants, industry, etc.*
  - *They have formed (and are in the process of forming more) alliances with other national societies, groups, and organizations, such as: WEF, APWA, NAFSA, ASCE, NAQUWA, etc.*

## REPORT ITEMS

### 5. State of Utah Updates:

- a. DWQ Programs and EPA by Jeff Studenka:  
*EPA is waiting to see how this new administration is going to play out and what effects that might have on the department. It is status quo for now.  
DWQ is now receiving comments on the new "Expedited Settlement Offer" program/form. If you have any comments, please send them in.*
- b. Municipal Program by Rhonda Thiele:

- c. Industrial Program by Mike George:  
*MSGP Sector P – invoiced ALL industrial facilities separately. MS4s should not have been invoiced. If you were (and you are an MS4) then don't pay that if you receive it in the mail. Cities have already done this in the past and so it is not applicable. Facilities, such as transfer stations, etc., however, still need to pay.*
- d. Construction Program by Harry Campbell:  
*As mentioned earlier, the ESO is out for comment period. Get the comments in to us. Also, any training sessions for the public, to get private sector CEU's need to file through Harry to get the necessary information to DOPL.*
- e. Storm Water Program by Jeanne Riley:  
*Jeanne: We are taking more calls than usual right now, due to the freeze/thaw cycles. When we refer a complaint (call) to you MS4s and contact you about the compliance issues, we expect you to follow up and respond. If it is a permitted site the use the IDDE for those track-out issues.  
Rhonda: remember, if you have been audited, then you need to develop not only the implementation strategy, but also establish the dates, of bringing the issues into compliance. Be proactive in developing your implementation plans. The same goes for changes to your SWMP documents.

6. USWAC Subcommittees Updates:

a. Industrial:

*Greg Baptist: Issues with timber product companies. IE – grinding and mulching of tree material. We have developed, or are in the process of developing new SIC codes for both large and small operations. The numbers are: 2434 and 0783. Looking to add BMPs and SOPs for these activities.*

b. Long Term Storm Water Management:

*Tom Beesley: We have now developed a template and it is posted on the website. Take a look at the USWAC website and try out the template. Send any feedback that you might have to our committee. We want folks to use the template and to be familiar with it. It is a tool to use intended to satisfy many of the requirements for MCM5.*

c. R.S.I. Program:

*Paul Taylor: the management of the program is currently in transition. Also, we have sent the scope of services and a request to LTAP to see what their fees might be to expand their role in administering the program.*

*Also, would like to remind MS4s that in Phase II there IS a requirement (at least some components) to have industrial inspections and administration, so it would be recommended to take advantage of Greg's offer to provide some training.*

d. R.S.W. Program:

*Dan Woodbury: the revisions to the teaching manual are nearing completion and with the new requirements (new permit, etc) the class is just about ready to start up again. We have targeted April to be ready to start teaching the class again. We also have joined with the RSI request to have LTAP look at the management and administration load to solicit their assistance. We hope to hear from them soon.*

*Also, a reminder goes out of the fall conference (in October) and there is currently a call for papers, so anyone that would like to present, or knows of someone that would be a good candidate to present a paper – now is the time to get those requests in.*

8. Stormwater Coalitions News and Updates:

a. Golden Spike:

*Water Fair is April 12 & 13 at the Golden Spike Arena. The County Health Department is a part of the coalition and will be participating in the Water Fair. One of our MS4's was audited. There is an RSI training scheduled for the 24<sup>th</sup> at the Weber County Building on 24<sup>th</sup> and Washington.*

b. Cache County:

*Cache County Water Fair is scheduled for May 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>.*

c. Davis County:

*The Davis County Water Fair is in March. It will be held at the Farmington Fairgrounds. March Coalition will be at North Salt Lake City Hall.*

d. Salt Lake County:

*The Salt Lake County Water Fair is scheduled for May 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> at Hogle Zoo.*

*An RSI class is scheduled for April 11<sup>th</sup> to be held at the Riverton Public Works Building. There will also be an RSI class in October (likely at the County complex).*

- e. Utah County:  
*Annual training meeting held Feb 7<sup>th</sup>, 2 sessions. Over 100 contractors attended.*

  - g. Utah Department Of Transportation:  
*Last month, Jeff introduced the UDOT portal. It is the “UDOT Learning Portal”. There will be a new training program taught through the Learning Management System staff. The ECS (Environmental Controls Supervisor) is not there yet, but will be added in the future. Harry added that the ECS is included in the permit as one of the qualifying training courses. We may want to look at re-wording that language to specify that it is “for UDOT projects only” under the ECS course.*

*Greg Baptist announced that there will be a CISEC class/training towards the end of March for the northern Utah area. The course will be held on a Thursday and Friday at the Salt Lake County complex. Another class/training will be held in southern Utah toward the end of April.*
