Trace reported that he has only received a few topics for the upcoming Stormwater Conference. He is looking for presentations on Municipal Operations and Good Housekeeping Minimum Control Measure. He also needs presentations for Industrial pollution prevention topics.

REPORT ITEMS

7. State of Utah Updates:

- a. DWQ Programs and EPA by Jeff Studenka: *EPA E-reporting rule, possibly issuing a draft rule near the end of the year for all electronic submittals of annual reports, NOIs, NOTs. Nutrient rules WWTP and Nitrogen, Phosphorus only monitoring for now. MS4 requirements for the time being is to use BMPs to address nutrients.*
- b. Municipal Program by Rhonda Thiele: *Rhonda will be presenting at Road School. The topic of her presentation is "Preparing for an audit". She has been busy reviewing the UDOT permit and following up with previous audits. Turning audit follow-up into a formal signed compliance agreement. Following up closely on the post audit items. The MS4s are required to submit a response on how to address deficiencies found during the audit with deadlines for compliance. Failure to comply with the corrections within the specified timeframe may constitute a violation of the MS4 permit. It was stated that "just because you've been audited doesn't mean you can relax". In June 2015 can expect a draft of the MS4 General Permit.*
- c. Industrial Program by Mike George: *Nothing to report.*
- d. Construction Program by Harry Campbell: *The inspection checklist is in PDF version and on the DWQ website. The website is being reorganized in a more friendly way for users. The Common Plan Permit came out in public notice; the public notice period is now over. Will have to re-public comment for the Common Plan Permit. Questions about what the purpose of the Common Plan Permit.*
- e. Storm Water Program by Jeanne Riley: *Nothing to report.*
- f. Storm Water Program by Monique Rodriguez: *Nothing to report.*
- g. Groundwater Protection Section by Brianna Ariotti: *State UIC program, working on an automated query that will give you the amount of underground injection wells your community has. You will be CC'd on any new underground injection wells that are received at the State, make sure Rhonda has your update contact information.*

- a. Cache County: *Bill Young reported that there's a RSI training on June 23rd in Logan, upcoming Water Fair with 1800 students attending April 28-29.*
 - b. Davis County: *Blake reported they are working on the water fair for April 22-23rd. Also distributing brochures that have been updated and developed within the Coalition.*
 - c. Salt Lake County: *RSI on May 19th in Riverton, water fair May 13-14 at the Hogle Zoo, working on the production of a new commercial to air this year.*
 - d. Utah County: *Most of the Utah County municipalities have adopted potable water conservation measures what could become a problem when enforcing dust control on construction sites. There was a discussion about other means to control dust besides using water.*
