The committee will also review any proposed storm water regulations to assess potential impacts on the regulated community.

### REPORT ITEMS

7. State of Utah Updates:

- a. DWQ Programs and EPA by Jeff Studenka: *The Long Term Stormwater Management Technical work group had its first meeting December 15. It was a first flush type of meeting to lay out the ground rules. A facilitator from the State executive director's office has been added to the group. Next meeting March 23. More attendees can be added, contact Jeff Studenka. When asked if there was any representation missing the response was academia. Dr. DuPont from Utah State University was not able to attend this meeting, but will be at the next one.*

*Nutrient core team stormwater effort is underway. There are three areas of effort: POTWs (wastewater treatment centers), agriculture (non-point source) and stormwater (point source) pollutants.*

*Expedited settlement offers are getting close to rolling out.*

*EPA remand rule became in effect on January 9. NOIs, SWMPs to get increased public comment. The next renewal may involve more public participation.*

*DWQ management, Assistant manager Mrs. Lamb retired, replaced by Kim Shelley (permitting background)*

- b. Municipal Program by Rhonda Thiele: *Has received some calls regarding some MS4's, needing help in responding to Illicit Discharges. Permit outlines very well the steps of what your responsibilities are (detection and then immediate cessation, documentation). If unable to cease discharge, should call the State to see if they can help. Even if you are relying on others for assistance, the MS4 is the one with the permit requirements, so you need to document the process. Emphasis put on not passing IDDE enforcement and oversight solely to health departments.*
- c. Industrial Program by Mike George: *Reissued group 4, no public comments, added a new SIC code (tree-trimmers) under sector A –timber products with help from the Industrial subcommittee. Changed analytical monitoring requirements as discussed in the past.*
- d. Construction Program by Harry Campbell: *CEUs for contractors can be listed with DOPL. Utah County is putting on another type of class to inform contractors and wanted to get State's help. RSI is an easy adjustment to add classes. Other classes require some leg work that requires 4-6 weeks to get through DOPL process. Contractors need to submit: name, company and license number to receive CEUs, and this information needs to be collected by instructors in order for them to get credits. State must approve class to warrant CEU's.*

*Update given on the Expedited Settlement Offer (ESO) program through the Division of Water Quality. Input from MS4's is desired. The goal is to be a simpler process and be less costly than traditional enforcement actions. Penalties may be up to 50% of regular penalty with the ESO process. The ESO will be sent after a violation has been discovered, no negotiation, signed and returned. If the violator does not want to sign it, then the process will follow the typical NOV steps. The ESO document will be sent to the members of USWAC/website for review. The ESO will be used by DWQ, and can be mimicked by MS4s if they desire. State penalty policy needs to be revised, which is taking place. The more feedback the better the result will be.*

- a. Industrial: *Nestor- Next meeting is the Monday before USWAC, 10:00 at SL County building.*
  - b. Post Construction: *Tom: "Long-term storm water management committee" there is a template that completes many of the requirements for Minimum Control Measure 5. As you use it send any feedback to the committee to adjust it or educate users more.*
  - c. R.S.I. Program: *Paul-(See attached RSI Training Calendar) New schedule for the year is out. Subcommittee is in process of seeing if it would be beneficial to increase LTAPs involvement in running the RSI program. APWA board meeting tomorrow to see if there is support from the board to do so. This should consolidate the management and make it run smoother rather than having multiple volunteers trying to run it.*
  - d. R.S.W. Program: *Trace-A joint subcommittee meeting was held in December with RSI. A scope of work for RSI and RSW management was drafted. Committee is in process of trying to help the APWA board understand how the RSI and RSW programs are managed. APWA annual planning meeting is tomorrow to review the scope of work. Ultimately it should improve the level of service for the contractors, inspectors, attendees etc. The website will be enhanced and improve the process. Training material is done, received comments, now putting the manual together. Part of the course will be for attendees to write an actual SWPPP. Created a mock development with contours and site plans, instead of trying to wash an existing one clean of names. Many SWPPPs appear to be written to the MS4, the Mock example is written from the point of view of the Operator/Contractor/SWPPP preparer writing instruction directly to the workforce/tradesmen doing the work. The manual is very thick. Will ask Harry for CEU approval for the RSW class. Day 1 instruction and day 2 is exam. This is not solely a multiple choice test, it will need a professional to grade them.*
  - e. Education and Training Program: *This subcommittee has been disbanded due to no action taken and a lack of need to exist at this time.*
