Mission Statement: The Utah Storm Water Advisory Committee will coordinate efforts to reduce storm water pollution and provide adequate flood control. The committee will jointly review governing regulations, disseminate information to enhance compliance with those regulated, promote effective storm water management training, and assist local municipalities and other interested parties to implement best management practices, consistent with their individual needs and resources. The committee will also review any proposed storm water regulations to assess potential impacts on the regulated community.

2. USWAC membership roster:

ACTION ITEMS

3. Minutes from the December 10th 2014 meeting: *The minutes were approved without amendments by George Burbidge, seconded by Blane Frandsen.*
4. 2015 USWAC Proposed Budget and Expenditures Discussion:
 - a. *What does the reimbursement cover? Time, traveling expenses, etc. for the one-day seminar.*
 - b. *There were two Coalitions that were being left out, so a one-day seminar/class was proposed to reach out to the Washington and Cache County Coalitions. This is not an RSI training class. It will be 4 hr morning MCMs, 4 hr afternoon reviewing questions and sharing forms.*
 - c. *The LID training for city planners and city engineers involves less travel expenses. The \$400 is for refreshments. Can the other trainings be made webinars as well? Yes, with the proper software.*
 - d. *Motion to approve by Paul Taylor, seconded by Steve Burgeon.*

5. USWAC meeting new setting for action, discussion, report and training items:
 - a. *Training pushed towards end of meeting to allow people to leave/stay. This month Nestor, next month Jason Jones, JUB, on enforcement. May/June training on the Industrial permitting. If you have any suggestions for topics send them to Nestor.*
6. One Day Seminar about “Low Impact Development” for city engineers and planners:
 - a. *DEQ Building, June 8th, 2015*
 - b. *DWQ: Why do we need to implement LID?*
 - c. *USWAC: How to implement LID?*
 - d. *Suggestion: have a sample LID ordinance to provide to attendees. Nestor is working on a template based on LA County.*
 - e. *This event needs to be coordinated with the DWQ Team.*

REPORT ITEMS

7. State of Utah Updates:
 - a. *Municipal Program by Rhonda Thiele: Small MS4 permit expires in July 1st 2015. Need to reapply 6 months in advance. The form is on the website. It is part of the application process. Since there is not a lot of space; what is in your SWMP supersedes what you put in this reapplication document. Rhonda will call at the end of the month those who have not re-applied. New MS4 permit: post-construction will be reinforced, no wholesale changes. Hope to put it out in the next couple months for stakeholder review before public notice.*
 - b. *Industrial Program by Mike George: Beefing up industrial webpage, take a look for changes. Developing a SWPPP template for industrial use.*
 - c. *Construction Program by Harry Campbell: Working on two permits: (1) Revised CGP and (2) single-lot, single-house. Asked USWAC to make comments. Will go to public notice next week. Goal was to make it shorter. Greg Davis of EPA guided what was needed it should pass EPA approval. The other permit is also close. Goal to issue on March 1st 2015.*
8. *DWQ Programs and EPA by Jeff Studenka: Happy new-year! EPA E-reporting rule: anything submitted to the DEQ is required to be submitted to the EPA in electronic format only. This rule is being completed and will probably go into effect by the end of the year. All NOIs, NOTs, annual report, etc. will all have to be submitted electronic only, no paper. No-Exposure (Industrial) & Low-Erosivity (Construction) Waivers will be electronic only after July 1st 2015. There will be a few fees associated if approved by legislature (\$50 - Low-Erosivity for project duration, \$100 - No-Exposure for 5-yrs). Nutrient rule, effective Jan 1, 2015, regarding Phosphorous, is in effect. Not for Stormwater yet. Others have to monitor, for a few years, to get a baseline. Stormwater sector will handle this through BMPs right now. This will be evaluated as*

permits are updated. EPA monthly Stormwater calls: not one this month, last year was green infrastructure. Seminars etc. will continue to be forwarded through the USWAC chair.

9. USWAC Subcommittees Updates:

- a. Industrial: *Steve Burgeon: first meeting today. Review Nestor's forms/template*
- b. Post Construction: *Nestor Gallo: presentation today and template for review*
- c. R.S.I. Program: *Paul: 400 people trained since September 23rd in Weber Co last month (36 attendees), Need help due to the demand. Committee has asked Coalitions to host one RSI class per year, Davis in March, Cache in November. Looking for commitments from other counties so they can be posted and publicized. Want to have regular classes for people to plan on. Need the support and help of the Coalitions*
- d. R.S.R. Program: *Trace no report*
- e. Common Plan Development: *Juan Garrido: completed work with the new permit. Single lot permit does not require certifications for inspectors.*

10. APWA News and Updates: *Trace: Stormwater operations (how to, housekeeping, fertilizer operations, etc.) theme for next conference, previously it was about administration. Stormwater tract continues to grow, and be highly attended. Some of the Stormwater vendors were not present, could use more next conference.*

11. Stormwater Coalitions News and Updates:

- a. Cache County: *Working on water fair, etc.*
- b. Davis County: *Discussing the training, water fair, preconstruction checklist for SWPPP review.*
- c. Salt Lake County: *Thanks for attending the symposium. Request for Proposals for new Stormwater commercial is out now, for May airing. Purchased 10,000 activity books for students.*
- d. Utah County: *Meets 2nd Thursday of each month, every other month. Workshops on the alternate months. See website for details. Working on stormwater awareness survey, done once every 5 years.*
- e. Washington County: *RSI scheduled, Ken Bricker has 4 planned this year. Jan 28th & 29th Training at the AGC. Landfill is doing Household Hazardous Waste collection. Training scheduled for April, Nestor coordinating.*
- f. Weber County: *RSI Jan 9th, very full. Agreement with Weber/Morgan Health department for spill response to enhance better understanding between agencies. Looking at changing the water fair setup. Water Fair facility is not great, looking at having it at Weber Basin, changing time frame from Spring to October. It may allow for more students to attend. Sending out packets to the fourth grade teachers.*

12. Other topics/ business: Paul Taylor: CISEC training on Feb 3rd and 4th
