The committee will jointly review governing regulations, disseminate information to enhance compliance with those regulated, promote effective storm water management training, and assist local municipalities and other interested parties to implement best management practices, consistent with their individual needs and resources. The committee will also review any proposed storm water regulations to assess potential impacts on the regulated community.

 - Jeanne Riley: *An increase in coordination for ID response with DWQ has been observed. Kevin can be a resource to local agencies in the response to IDs; can also help with enforcement. For chronic construction violations, DWQ can assist with enforcement. Expressed a need for a*

repository for BMP effectiveness data, like the National BMP Data Base but for Utah. Discussion ensued. A motion by USWAC and vote to have Long Term Storm Water Management Subcommittee research this. Note the small MS4 permit requirement for 90 percentile storm retention and LID requirements will be moved from March 1st 2019 to September 1st 2019.
