Mission Statement: The Utah Storm Water Advisory Committee will coordinate efforts to reduce storm water pollution and provide adequate flood control. The committee will jointly review governing regulations, disseminate information to enhance compliance with those regulated, promote effective storm water management training, and assist local municipalities and other interested parties to implement best management practices, consistent with their individual needs and resources. The committee will also review any proposed storm water regulations to assess potential impacts on the regulated community.

 - b. CGP on public notice until May 29th.
 - c. Lisa prepared a sheet of directions on CGP, how to obtain an NOI and SWPPP. Located on the states construction webpage.

 - i. EPA Federal CGP Format
 - ii. Buffer requirements moved to appendix A
 - iii. Removed option for no discharge.
 - iv. Added 60 day grace period for project completion (project termination)
 - v. Permit Renewal
 1. "Automatic coverage" removed.
 2. Permitted may be required to "acknowledge" the revised permit.
 3. Permittee will be emailed renewal instructions.
 4. Maintenance concerns
 - a. Address immediately if practicable, within 7 days or prior to weather.

5. Impaired waters
 - a. SWPPP must address the impairment and how it is being treated. This only applies to the first water being discharged to.
 - b. Working on a map of areas of approved TMDLs.
 6. Inspection Frequencies
 - a. *Additional notes on the slides.*
 7. Corrective action timeframes
 - a. Must be documented within 24 hours.
 8. SWPPP writer certifications.
 - a. Required if site is greater than 5 acres, or if the site has challenging conditions.
 - i. Implementation date of Jan 1, 2021.
 9. SWPPP availability
 - a. 30 minute time frame removed.
 - b. Must be kept onsite or online as long as personnel can access it.
 10. Public notice ends May 29th.
 11. Response comments June 2019
 12. Finalize and reissue permit to July 1, 2019.
 13. The permit does mention a three month period where once the new permit is in place, contractor has three months to meet the new requirements.
- e. How do we update to the new permit? Permittee will be emailed instructions on obtaining coverage under the new permit. There will be no fee to renew. Coverage is \$150 for 1 year. Looking to have an automatic renewal, but needs to be established by the state. Follow up
